News from the Social Action Committee

The Social Action Committee held its first meeting on Wednesday, June 9, 2021 at 7pm, via Zoom. The Committee identified the following short list of ideas to develop in our 2021-2022 church year:

- a) connect and partner with local individuals / groups to discuss ideas and share resources (ex. support and forward the work of Margaret de Cruz on climate and environmental justice);
- b) organize workshops / presentations / other activities to educate ourselves and our surrounding community on topics of import (ex. the systemic nature of racism and other oppressions); and,
- c) maintain regular contact with and seek additional ways to support the Long Island Area Council, its Social Justice Roundtable, and other regional organizations that promote justice, equity, and fairness for all (ex. have a regular presence at meetings of the Southold Justice Review & Reform Task Force and the Southold Town Ant-Bias Task Force).

We received an email, dated May 25th, from Rev. Kimberly Quinn Johnson, First UU Congregation of the South Fork, and recalled her memorable April sermon on "The Zen of Washing Dishes." She introduced us to newly formed NY UU Justice Network for "advancing justice and UU values across our state." She encouraged us to visit their website https://www.nyuuj.org for further info, resources and a recording of their February 28 Winter Gathering to: support climate justice; end solitary confinement; and, authorize medical aid in dying. The consensus of the Committee was that joining NYUUJ would be an excellent way for our small congregation to "leverage our power for maximum impact" at the state level. At the Board meeting on June 23, the Board unanimously decided to make a financial contribution to NYUUJ by donating the next four months of the congregation's First Sunday collection to NYUUJ.

After reviewing FAQ&A about the history and background of the 8th Principle, which are covered in depth online https://www.8thprincipleuu.org, the group agreed that an 8th Principle Task Force (as opposed to a subcommittee of Social Action) be established to explore how to call a congregational vote on the adoption of the 8th Principle: We covenant to affirm and promote: Journeying toward spiritual wholeness by building a diverse, multicultural Beloved Community by our actions that accountably dismantle racism and other oppressions in ourselves and our institutions.

Recognizing that this is just the beginning of the process, the Committee discussed:

- a) developing ways to have the congregation discuss the 8th Principle;
- b) considering other oppressions, such as the criminalization of people living in poverty and living with mental illness and addiction; and.
- c) updating the church bylaws. Though the bylaws include steps to make amendments, there is nothing regarding any of the Principles.
