News from the Social Action Committee & 8th Principle Task Force

UUA's "30 Days of Love 2023" started in January on Martin Luther King, Jr. Day and ran through the week of Valentine's Day in February. During that time, we were invited to participate in a free congregational training offered by Side With Love's UPLIFT Action campaign, aptly beginning during Week 2: Embodiment - LQBTQIA+, Gender & Reproductive Justice. The three-part series, "Organizing for Reproductive Justice," consisting of two-hour online sessions (January 29, February 12 & February 26), was very informative. Unfortunately, more than a few people had difficulty logging in - EACH time - nice to know I'm not the only technophobe. Follow-up slides, recordings and resources from the series have been emailed to each participant. Please note that the email from Session 3 includes a "Participant Survey" which needs to be completed by March 15, 2023.

The annual month of spiritual nourishment, political grounding, and shared practices of faith and justice continued from Side With Love in cooperation with the **Love Resists** campaign during **Week 3: Healing - Decriminalization** (inclusive of Racial Justice and Immigration Justice); and with the **Create Climate Justice** campaign during **Week 4: Resilience – Climate Justice** (inclusive of Indigenous Sovereignty and Climate Resilience).

And this year we were offered **Bonus Days: Blessings - Liberatory Intersections.** If you missed any of the above or would like to know more:

Thank you to everyone who supported our **Warm Hearts, Warm Feet Sock Drive** during Southold's *Winterfest Celebration 2023*, on Saturday, February 18th. And a huge thank you to Susan Pond, who created a warm and welcoming "First Universalist Church of Southold" table complete with homemade cookies; other goodies to "make life sweet" for all who visited, and a new church banner. Thank you, again, to those who: came by; dropped off lots of socks and even some gloves; and, stayed long enough to feel you needed to move on before you froze in place like an ice sculpture. Our hearts were warmed by the sight of downtown Southold filled with smiling faces of people AND dogs, but our toes and hands reminded us of the reason for

our presence (esp. the toes). Between our congregation's **February STP** collection and additional donations at Winterfest (many from the public), a check for \$ 300.00 is being mailed to **Maureen's Haven, in Riverhead** and the large box that Susan Pond delivered to them was filled to overflowing. Thank you ALL!

At the February Board meeting, SAC / 8th Principle Task Force requested Board approvals for the following:

- 1) that our March STP recipient be Mujeres de Esperanza (translates to "Women of Hope"), a chapter of which meets at Rural & Migrant Ministry (R&MM), with whom we are all familiar. Its purpose is "to inspire, challenge, and unite generations, denominations and different ministries in favor of the most challenged of our times through engaging their leadership in prayer, service, and advocacy." Proceeds from the March STP will be donated to Mujeres de Esperanza, in memory of the late Sister Margaret Smyth, who was a leader in this initiative:
- 2) that our April STP recipient be Save the Children (based in Fairfield, CT) supporting emergency relief efforts for the survivors of the Turkey and Syria earthquakes. Save the Children is on the ground in the region providing access to food, shelter and warm clothing, and are further planning for long-term recovery efforts. Among other accolades, Save the Children has the highest rating from Charity Navigator (four out of a possible four stars, indicating that the organization adheres to good governance and other best practices that minimize the chance of unethical activities and executes its mission in a fiscally responsible way). Save the Children has ranked 31st on *Forbes* list of America's Top 100 Charities and also meets the 20 standards needed to be named an "accredited national charity" by the Better Business Bureau: Wise Giving Alliance.

The <u>next</u> meeting of the Social Action Committee (SAC) / 8th Principle Task Force will be on the <u>second Wednesday of the month</u>, March 8, 2023, at the Southold Free Library and via Zoom, from 4:00pm to 5:00pm, in the Lucy Hallock Folk Meeting Room. On the agenda:

- Sunday, March 19th, 4:00 5:30pm, UUA Skill Up: Evaluation is an Act of Love to help prep and build future training sessions for UU the Vote. FYI Skill Ups occur the 3rd Sunday of most months.
