Dear Beloved Community,

"There are some things in our society, some things in our world, to which we should never be adjusted."

Martin Luther King spoke these words before a meeting of the American Psychological Association in 1967, and they reflect his views of resistance.

Resistance is a double-edged sword – when we resist change too much, we become adjusted to nostalgia rather than reality. When we resist injustice, however, we provide the necessary traction for the change that we wish to see. "Being maladjusted" to racism, homophobia and transphobia, control of women's bodies, fossil fuels, et cetera, means we resist those things that keep oppression in place.

"Maladjustment," rather than a deficiency, becomes an asset – maybe even a prayer or calling. Let us be "maladjusted" to that which promotes death, endangers the lives of children, and puts profit over survival. Becoming maladjusted to these things is what will ensure our survival.

As we explore the theme of resistance, consider one thing that you wish to be "maladjusted" to. What are you interested in opposing? What do you wish to resist? Where do your deepest hopes lie?

News from the Social Action Committee & 8th Principle Task Force

Thank you to everyone who supported our March Share-the-Plate recipient. Mujeres de Esperanza United (MDE) is a national leadership initiative to strengthen the Hispanic Community through uniting women; empowering their compassionate service; and increasing their advocacy voice. The NYS chapter, SEPA Mujer, Inc., has been working on LI since 1993 by bringing together community members and advocates to speak out against injustice, provide access to opportunities and services, take a stand against domestic violence and other abuses, and push for social change, with offices in Patchogue, Hampton Bays, Riverhead and Huntington Station. Their check for \$220 will be made out "in memory of the late Sister Margaret Rose Smyth," who was a leader in this initiative.

At the February Board meeting, **Save the Children** (based in Fairfield, CT) was approved as our April STP recipient. Through their Children's Emergency Fund, Save the Children maintains ongoing efforts in SE Türkiye and NW Syria, a region already in crisis before the devastating earthquakes and numerous aftershocks struck in February. A month later, more than 850,000 children remain displaced.

BTW - Save the Children has long been working in the US to support children and their communities prevent, prepare for, and recover from climate-induced disasters. Their Children's Emergency Fund was one of the first organizations providing water, food, hygiene kits and diapers after deadly tornadoes struck rural Mississippi on March 24, 2023.

At the March Board meeting, SAC received approval for our May STP recipient: **North Fork Environmental Council (NFEC)**, a non-profit, volunteer organization in Mattituck. Since 1972, NFEC's core mission has been to educate the public on important environmental issues that impact the quality of all life on the North Fork, and to help bring about timely resolutions. Visit their Facebook page or website to learn more about their "mission, initiatives, and results of [five] decades of advocacy." NFEC is once again holding REPAIR CAFE (see ad on page 4). **Date & time –** Sat., May 6, 2023, from 1:00pm - 4:00pm. **Place -** Floyd Memorial Library, 539 First St, Greenport.

"**Prophetic Voices**," a series of five documentary films that have garnered numerous awards, will be aired over the next five months beginning in April and finishing in August. All five showings will be on Sunday afternoons from 2:00pm - 4:00pm at Holy Trinity Episcopal Church. Additional information and details will be forthcoming.

Part 1: "BOENHOEFFER" on Sunday, April 23, 2023

This newly- remastered, 90-minute version explores the life of Dietrich Bonhoeffer, the famed German theologian and writer, who joined the resistance to stop Adolf Hitler and the Nazis.

Sat., April 29, 2023, 12:00pm - 2:00pm we will be holding a drive-through drop-off in the church parking lot to benefit the Food Bank of the North Fork Spanish Apostolate Food in Riverhead – another of Sister Margaret's projects to support the local migrant workers, immigrants and Hispanic residents, founded in 1966. Among the many services (including language, citizenship, cultural education; health care education; parenting skills workshops; legal support), the organization distributes food five days a week.

Like most food banks, they are in need of non-perishable food (e.g. canned goods, cereals); baby wipes and diapers (esp. #5 & #6); and personal items (e.g. shampoo, deodorant) which cannot be purchased with SNAP or WIC benefits. Mentioned was the need for clothing for young mothers and their children, so those items would also be welcomed.
