Dear Beloved Community,

Without the time and space for creativity in our lives, it is nearly impossible to live lives of meaning. History attests to the creativity that people pursue even when they have little else to sustain them. During wartime, or during times of great upheaval, people make space to create poetry, or compose music – even to remember and pass down recipes.

When we exercise our creativity, both in creating works of art and in allowing ourselves to brainstorm and step outside our comfort zone, we become more like the creator ourselves. Julia Cameron, the screenwriter who wrote an influential book called *The Artist's Way* which helps people get past writer's block, calls the process of reclaiming our creativity G.O.D. – Good Orderly Direction. For her, creativity exists as a natural impulse that we are all too ready to bury under the weight of expectations. Although there is a spirituality present in this idea of Good Orderly Direction, I don't think you need to have a fixed idea about the existence of God to tap into the idea that once we put ourselves in touch with our own creativity, we are also in touch with that which revives us when nothing else can.

As spring starts turning towards summer, I hope for you many hours of time devoted to expanding your notion of creativity – of finding people to be creative with, or honoring your own creative pursuits, whatever they may be.

April launched our showing of the 5-part series, "**Prophetic Voices**," of award-winning documentary films, with **Part 1:** "**BOENHOEFFER**" which explored the life of Dietrich Bonhoeffer, the Lutheran theologian and writer who became one of the early voices of resistance to the rise of Adolf Hitler. He helped found the breakaway Confessing Church, whose members resisted National Socialism in a movement that cost Bonhoeffer his life only weeks before the end of World War II.

The next showing, with discussion afterward, will be Sun., May 21, 2-4 p.m., at Holy Trinity Church. Part 2: "An American Conscience - the Reinhold Niebuhr Story," about the author of Serenity Prayer, one of the most quoted writings in American Literature. "Yet Niebuhr's impact was far greater, as presidents like Jimmy Carter and civil rights leaders like Martin Luther King, Jr. often turned to his writings for guidance and inspiration on the most volatile political and social issues of the 20th Century." - filmmaker Martin Doblmeier
