Dear Beloved Community,

Sometimes, the tiniest differences between words can be instructive. I often check dictionary definitions as a kind of sacred text – does the definition given by the lexicographer have the same resonance with me? What do I hear when I hear that definition or word? What stirs me up if I repeat a word or phrase over and over again, either out loud or in my mind?

This month, the word I am pondering is "delight" – our Soul Matters theme for the month. Delight, which is often equated with joy, but recently I was reminded of some differences that are encountered when you dig deeper.

Joy often indicates something sudden – a discovery or a sudden feeling of excitement – delight is something more enticing and alluring. In Latin, *Delictare* means to take delight in something. The phrase conjures up fine food, music or nature – the delectable strawberries of the North Fork, for example.

Finding things, people, or activities to take delight in helps sustain us in the long term. When we start taking delight in something new, we shift our values. We seek ways to preserve what is important to us – the landscape around us, the health and safety of our friends and neighbors, and many other things. We find the means to counter despair, and we find ourselves sharing what we have found. What better way to find new friends than around a shared delight, hobby, or activity?

As we swing into summer, take time to delight yourself and others with a sense of hope, renewal, and beauty. I will be away from the latter half of June through the month of July, visiting my family and attending General Assembly in Pittsburgh.

News from the Social Action Committee & 8th Principle Task Force

SAC / 8th Principle Task Force requested / received Board of Trustees approval for the following organizations to become <u>First Sunday of the Month "Share the Plate" (STP) recipients:</u>

<u>June</u> - Sound Justice Initiative, a nonprofit organization in Riverhead. Founder, Kerry Spooner, spoke to our congregation in October of 2022 about the transformative power of education to change people's lives. Sound Justice Initiative was our January STP recipient and they will also be our June STP recipient to support their ongoing collaboration with Stony Brook University and the Suffolk County Sheriff Office's rehabilitation program.

<u>July</u> - Gold Boots Foundation was created by Samantha Payne-Markel, after six North Fork and Shelter Island residents died from ingesting fentanyl-laced cocaine in August of 2021. She sought to keep alive the name of one of those six and her then boyfriend, Seth Thomas Tramontana, whose signature footwear was "Gold Boots." Dedicated to raising awareness of overdose risk and prevention and funding college scholarships for Greenport High School students, Ms.Payne-Markel also hopes to introduce grief services to the North Fork, which she found hard to come by in 2021.

In addition, SAC asked / received permission that \$ 110 previously given by the congregation in order to hold an Opioid Overdose Prevention Clinic, be utilized for that purpose.

SAC & 8th Principle Task Force (cont'd.)

<u>August</u> - Women Cross DMZ (WCDMZ), mobilizing women globally to promote peace, as well as denuclearization and demilitarization on the Korean Peninsula. July 27, 2023 is the 70th anniversary of the signing of the Korean War Armistice, which halted but technically did not end the war. Since forming in 2014, WCDMZ has been calling for the need for a formal peace agreement and the reuniting of separated families.

First U of Southold member, Aiyoung Choi, has been very active with this organization, currently serving as their Board President. She will be speaking at the worship service on Sunday, August 6, 2023 about the work of WCDMZ. We also hope to host a watch party (sometime this summer) of the documentary film "Crossings" by Emmy-award winning filmmaker Deann Borshay Liem.
